



### 9-28.900 - Voluntary Disclosures

- [T]he Department encourages corporations...to conduct internal investigations and to disclose the relevant facts to the appropriate authorities. [For s]ome agencies...self-reporting, coupled with remediation and additional criteria, may qualify the corporation for amnesty or reduced sanctions.
- Even in the absence of a formal program, prosecutors may consider a corporation's timely and voluntary disclosure....

# 9-28.720 - Cooperation: Disclosing the Relevant Facts

 Eligibility for cooperation credit is not predicated upon the waiver of attorney-client privilege or work product protection. Instead, the sort of cooperation that is most valuable to resolving allegations of misconduct by a corporation and its officers, directors, employees, or agents is disclosure of the relevant facts concerning such misconduct.

### 9-28.210 - Focus on Individual Wrongdoers

 A. General Principle: Prosecution of a corporation is not a substitute for the prosecution of criminally culpable individuals within or without the corporation....Provable individual culpability should be pursued, particularly if it relates to high-level corporate officers, even in the face of an offer of a corporate guilty plea or some other disposition of the charges against the corporation....

This reality – reciprocal information sharing – is giving rise to a developing trend, especially as it relates to international enforcement of criminal laws in the white collar arena. And the emerging trend is this: due in part to the significant assistance we provide to our foreign partners, there has been an increase in multijurisdictional prosecutions of criminal conduct, particularly when that conduct is transnational in nature and when several countries have prosecutorial authority over it.


